Specialist activities

for children with identified SLC needs who are on our caseload and may require additional support.

Targeted activities

for children with SLC needs/those who benefit from additional input to access the curriculum—lots of Targeted Language Groups, for example, **Talking Tables**, **Word Wanderers** and **Lego Therapy** are run by school with SLT support.

Universal activities

support every child / whole school, - this could include advice, parent drop-in sessions, environmental observations or staff training sessions.
